Acting Deputy to the Commanding General

Ms. Tycer is the acting Deputy to the Commanding General, U.S. Army Contracting Command, as of Nov. 23, 2015. She is also ACC Chief Counsel. Ms. Tycer was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in January 2013.

ACC, a subordinate command of Army Materiel Command, is comprised of two subordinate commands—the U.S. Army Mission and Installation Contracting Command and the U.S. Army Expeditionary Contracting Command—and six major contracting centers. ACC provides global contracting support to warfighters engaged in military operations, weapon system acquisition, life cycle management and sustainment and acquisition of goods and services vital to the Soldier's mission and well-being. Its workforce includes more than 6,000 military and civilian personnel at more than 100 locations worldwide. ACC awarded and managed more than 173,000 contract actions valued at more than \$54.5 billion in fiscal year 2015.



Prior to arriving at ACC Ms. Tycer served as associate counsel in the AMC Office of Command Counsel's Business Law Division.

She began her civil service career in 2008, when she joined the Aviation and Missile Life Cycle Management Command Legal Office as an attorney advisor in the Acquisition Law Branch. She is a recipient of the Department of the Army Achievement Medal for Civilian Service.

Before joining the federal government, Ms. Tycer spent 17 years in private practice as a civil litigator in federal and state courts in Florida and Tennessee. She progressed from associate to partner to owner of her own law firm. As an associate in the Jacksonville, Fla., firm of Dale and Bald, P.A., Ms. Tycer's practice focused on government contracting, product liability and professional malpractice.

As a partner in the Columbia, Tenn., firm of Hardin, Parkes and Kettering, PLLC, her practice involved federal jurisdiction cases in the areas of employment and labor law, civil rights, tort and contract law.

As a sole practitioner in Pulaski, Tenn., Ms. Tycer expanded her litigation practice to include mediation services.

Prior to attending law school, Ms. Tycer worked for seven years in the defense industry as a financial liaison and senior contract administrator with the Harris Corp., Government Division in Palm Bay, Fla. Ms. Tycer received her Juris Doctor with honors from the University of Florida College of Law at Gainesville, and a Master of Science in contract and acquisition management from the Florida Institute of Technology at Melbourne. Ms. Tycer received a Bachelor of Arts in economics/sociology from George Mason University, Fairfax, Va.

Ms. Tycer is married to Aubrey Tycer and they have two daughters, Whitney Tycer and Hannah Tycer, and two sons, Parker Tycer and Jordan Tycer.
