Offeror's shall name the teaming matrix IAW L.5.1.8 (c).
109	RFP Volume 1 - General Documents Attachment 0015	Attachment 0015 still refers to Attachment XX - Teaming Matrix. Should the Offeror modify this reference to reflect Attachment 0005, Tab 2?	Correct, Attachment 0015 should reflect Attachment 0005, Tab 2 instead of Attachment XX-Teaming Matrix.
110	RFP L.5.3.5.2.1, pg. 53	<p>RFP states: "Offeror and Teammates: From the date of the Offeror's original BOA proposal and the closing date of this RFP." Since Offerors typically finalize proposals days in advance of the closing date of an RFP, it is difficult to certify that the Past Performance volume responds to all terminated contracts or adverse past performance up until a date in the future, the closing date of the RFP (2016 JAN 19). We recommend changing the two cited paragraphs to:</p> <p>"L.5.3.5.1.1 Offeror and Teammates: From the date of the Offeror's original BOA RFP Step 2 proposal to two weeks after the issuance date of this RFP (2015 DEC 31)"</p> <p>"L.5.3.5.2.1 Offeror and Teammates: From the date of the Offeror's original BOA proposal to two weeks after the issuance date of this RFP (2015 DEC 31)"</p> <p>Also, are "original BOA RFP Step 2 proposal" and "original BOA proposal" meant interchangeably? Or do they represent potentially different dates?</p>	In regard to the first recommendation, no change will be made to section L.5.3.5.2.1. In response to the second question, yes--these two dates are the same.

111	TE 1G M-S-T; PWS, Section C-1, Page 10, Paragraph 1.4.1, section C-1	In TE 1G M-S-T Functional Labor Category 1 Hours EAS, 2,008 hours appears to be the labor hours used for an FTE. However, paragraph 1.4.1, section C-1, Page 10 of the PWS stipulates that the hours of operation are Monday through Friday 0700-1630 with a 40 hour work week. Will the government please provide the derivation for 2,008 hours?	While the PWS requires a minimum 40 hours per week, the Government's known requirement at the time of the RFP release is expressed in the provided workload data. 2,008 hours as indicated at TE 1-M-S-T includes requirements above the 40 hours per week based on the increased effort during issues and turn-in of supported equipment. In other words, temporary surges during the PoP where employees will be required to work in excess of 40 hours per week for certain periods of time. Should the Government require contractor support that requires overtime pay in accordance with German labor laws that overtime must be approved by the appropriate Contactor Officer and is subject to the availability of funds.
