3			Basic Ordering Agreement (BOA) Holder didn't think the workload data included Dining Facility (DFAC) (equipment maintenance of personal property)	The DFAC requirement is identified in the DRAFT Exhibit A - TE M-S-T-001 Functional Labor Category 1 Hours (Alaska) document under the "Requirement" of "Appliance Repair and supporting functions". Additionally DRAFT Attachment 0001 - Performance Work Statement (PWS), Paragraph 5.1.1 states "The Materiel Maintenance Division (MMD) provides support for other Army programs, not limited to the following: Dining Facility (DFAC) Equipment..." . Furthermore, PWS Paragraph 5.3.15 states, "A listing of all know equipment located at the two main and two Warm base DFACs are provided in TE 5M-001, Alaska Density List. It is expected, the contractor will occasionally be required to travel from Ft Greely to Ft Wainwright and to the two Warm base DFACs located at Black Rapids and Bolio Lake..."
4			The Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) states it is only valid for Department Public Works (DPW). Is this a valid CBA for the Logistics Readiness Center (LRC) Maintenance Operations?	No, as stated in the DRAFT Exhibit E, TE 1G-005 Key and Specified Non Key Positions, the applicable work covered under the current CBA is work performed under the CBA position "General Maintenance". The Government will be updating Attachment 0017 - CBA SCA Crosswalk to provide further clarification as well.
5			Workload in Maintenance is very low, but contains numerous Service Contract Act (SCA) descriptions. Does the Government want all SCA descriptions priced for fractions of an FTE?	In accordance with RFP L.5.2.1.1.(c)(5)(i), Offerors are allowed to propose fractional Full-Time Equivalent (FTEs). Offerors must determine the appropriate labor category based on its experience performing efforts such as the requirements of this solicitation and propose accordingly.

Will the Government revise the workload data?</p>	<p>Reference DRAFT Exhibit E - TE 1G-005 Key and Specified Non-Key Positions document, specifically the Warehouse Specialist (Non-Key Position). The position description identifies the following capabilities: constructs and repairs boxes, pallets, wood bracing to be used in shipping and storage as needed.</p> <p>In addition, DRAFT Attachment 0001 - PWS, Paragraph 5.16.6 states in part: "The contractor shall perform Stock Readiness to include packing and crating services, long- life reusable containers (LLRC), ..."</p>
7			<p>Is the Contractor responsible for arctic clothing for contractor employees, or will the Government reimburse them?</p>	<p>Please reference DRAFT Attachment 0001 - PWS, Paragraph 3.5.7. The Government will not allow reimbursement for items exempted from the OSHA requirements.</p>
8			<p>What is the response time(s) for repair of DFAC equipment for the remote locations (Black Rapids and Bolio Lake)?</p>	<p>As noted in DRAFT Attachment 0001 - PWS, Paragraph 5.3.15.16 "The contractor will be notified of required repair via telephonic or E-mail. Emergency work orders must begin within 2 hours of notification. Priority of fixing with timelines for response are listed below. The COR in the Work Order will specify the item that needs to be repaired (depending on parts availability) and the priority level of that item. For instance if a critical item (i.e., griddle) goes down, and the priority level would be a P-1 or in process of being repaired within the day.</p> <p>P-1 is 2 hours (Emergency) P-2 is 48 hours (Standard) P-3 is 7 days (Standard) P-4 is 30 days (for warm base operations)"</p>
