The RFP attachment Reference (B): 0007 Dept of Labor Wage Determination document lists Data Entry Operator II as occupation code 01052. Which is correct or is one of the documents in error?</p> <p>Reference (A): 01152 DATA ENTRY OPERATOR II This position requires the application of experience and judgment in selecting procedures to be followed, and searching for interpreting, selecting, or coding items to be entered from a variety of document sources. The Data Entry Operator II may occasionally perform routine work as described for Data Entry Operator I. Excluded are operators above Level II using the key entry controls to access, read, and evaluate the substance of specific records to take substantive actions, or to make entices requiring a similar level of knowledge.</p> <p>Reference (B) 01051 - Data Entry Operator I 01052 - Data Entry Operator II 01060 - Dispatcher, Motor Vehicle 01070 - Document Preparation Clerk</p>	<p>The Government recognizes there is a discrepancy between the Department of Labor Wage Determination (WD) and the Service Contract Act (SCA) Directory of Occupations (5th Edition). Offerors shall use the codes found in the WD when completing Attachment 0002 Staffing Labor Mix.</p>
	Attachment 0007, Dept of Labor Wage Determination, page 8. 2	<p>Is the 4% differential applicable to personnel working with or near ammunition to SCA positions in this RFP? See quoted section from SCA wage determination document page 8 below. "A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay."</p>	<p>The Government updated Exhibit A TE 1 M-S-T-001 Functional Labor Category 1 Hours Fort Bragg and Exhibit E TE 1G-005 Key and Specified Non-Key Positions to provide clarification on the HAZMAT Differentials which are identified in Attachment 0007.</p> <p>Draft RFP Q&A RFP2 is revised as follows: Q: What is the ASP Hazardous pay percentage differential? Does everyone working in the ASP get this? A: The ASP Hazardous pay percentage differential is 4% for Storage and Warehousing Support and 8% for all others with the exception of drivers or individuals performing in administrative positions as these positions do not receive this differential.</p>

Hours per employee must be commensurate with the period of performance and the employee type (SCA, Exempt). This will be used to identify and propose hour's specific to the transition-in date as not all portions of this effort will start at the same time. See L.2.8 for more information."</p> <p>Would the Government please clarify what Offerors are to provide in column C on the 'FTE Count Base Period Only' tab of Attachment 0002? Are Offerors to provide the total productive base period hours proposed for a given position or the productive hours per FTE by position?</p>	<p>Offerors are required to provide the productive hours per position per FTE. Section L, paragraph L.5.2.1.1(c)(6)(vi) was updated to clarify. Additionally, Attachment 0002 was updated to include an example tab for the base period.</p>
6	Exhibit D, Technical Exhibit 1G-003, Page 1, Hours of Operations, LRC Transportation Division, Air Movement, and Shop or Work Area.	<p>The Unit Movements Branch (UMB), UMB Work Centers, and Air Movement shops or work areas are not identified, provided or defined in the Performance Work Statement, or TE 1 M-S-T Minimum Functional Labor Category 1 Hours for Fort Bragg Transportation. Because these activities have specific requirements for hours of operations, would the government provide a key that identifies/relates these areas to the established, TE 1 M-S-T Minimum Functional Labor Category 1 Hours for Fort Bragg Transportation data?</p>	<p>The Government updated TE 1G-003 to remove Air Movements and Unit Moves hours. Air Movements is within the ADACG work area and the Unit Movements is broken out in the ITDSA, Movement Control Center, Container Management and Rail Support Activity.</p>
7	Solicitation, Pages 56, 58, 59 and 69. L.5.2.1.1(a)(3)(iii), L.5.2.1.2(a)(3)(iii), L.5.2.1.3(a)(3)(iii) and L.5.5.4.4(iii)	<p>Each of the noted sections lists the required font sizes, but does not mention the font style required. Are offerors free to use any font style?</p>	<p>There is not a limitation to font style. Offerors may use any font style.</p>
9	Exhibit A TE 1 M-S-T-001 Functional Labor Category 1 Hours Fort Bragg	<p>On the FINAL TE1 M-S-T, under the Production Control there is an additional requirement for "Perform all aspects of managing, maintaining, ordering, reordering, adjusting and inventorying Bench/Shop Stock. Perform and manage all aspects of the Document Control Register and reconcile same with the appropriate SARSS activities. Perform all aspects of managing the required repair parts necessary using processes within the applicable LIS."</p> <p>Question: With this additional requirement, will the Government identify the number of FTE and which sub-CLINs this work falls under?</p>	<p>There is no additional requirement. Rather, the Government provided an additional description to add clarity on what the contractor is required to perform.</p>
10	Exhibit E TE 1G-005 Key and Specified Non-Key Positions	<p>The Key and Specified Non-Key Positions do not list a Human Resources Generalist. On the Fort Stewart proposal it was a listed as a Key Position for a smaller contract.</p> <p>Question: With Fort Bragg being a larger contract, would the Government consider adding a Human Resource Generalist to the Key and Specified Non-Key listing?</p>	<p>The Government provided the required key and specified non-key positions in this Technical Exhibit. The Offeror may propose this position as part of its unique approach if it determines it necessary; however, the Government will not add this position to this TE.</p>
11	PWS Para 1.12.1, Other Direct Costs	<p>Are Steel Toe Boots considered a specialty item in accordance with OSHA requirements for particular personnel under this contract and considered a reimbursable item, as individual protective equipment, in accordance with PWS Para 1.12.1, Other Direct Costs?</p>	<p>According to OSHA, steel toed boots are not considered a specialty item. However, the employer can require safety-toe footwear to be worn at all times if the employer has conducted a workplace hazard assessment and concluded that hazards are present, or are likely to be present. The LRC conducted a hazard assessment which concluded that steel toed boots provide adequate protection against the hazards on the job. The footwear is not required to be provided by the employer at no cost to the employees, therefore, LRC has agreed to provide a \$50 stipend to each authorized employee to purchase the boots and the employee is responsible for any cost exceeding the \$50.</p>

13	Solicitation, Section L.2.8, page 51 and TE-1	As the government has provided staggered start dates based on current contract end dates for incumbent contracts, in order to properly allocate hours by mission, please provide the mapping of each of these efforts on TE-1 which ties it to the PWS sections. Without this information, it is difficult to determine the start dates for each section/mission and allocate the hours accordingly. As an alternative, for pricing/evaluation purposes only, can the government align all efforts with a single NTP?	<p>The Allocation Tab in the Cost/Price Matrix (Attachment 0005) breaks down the Maintenance, Supply and Transportation CLINs into sub-CLINs. The columns to the right of "MINIMUM FLC1 HOURS" in Exhibit A TE 1 M-S-T-001 Functional Labor Category 1 Hours Fort Bragg identify the applicable percentage of hours for each sub-CLIN.</p> <p>L.2.8 identifies the following services that will be consolidated into this contract. Below is a list of these services and the applicable sub-CLINs:</p> <p>Logistics Support Services (2AA; 2AB; 2AC; 2AD; 2AE; 2AF; 2AG; 3AA; 3AE; 4AA; 4AB; 4AC; 4AD; 4AE; 4AF; 4AH; and 4AI) PDTE (3AF) ASP (3AB) / CIF (3AC) Installation Asset Management (3AD) TMP (4AG)</p>

Please confirm that the file naming convention should include "Sub_Name" and should not be filled out by the Prime.	The Letter of Consent (Attachment 0004) should be filled out by each Major Subcontractor / Teammate expected to perform 20% or more of the Offeror's total estimated dollar value. The Letter of Consent shall be submitted by the Offeror as part of its proposal. The naming convention remains unchanged.
15	L.5.3.5; L.5.3.5 (c) (1); L.5.3.5 (c) (4), Attachment 0003	Reference L.5.3.5 – Performance Questionnaire states: "A separate questionnaire shall be provided for the Offeror and each proposed Teammate and Major Subcontractor..." However, the Naming Convention (L.5.3.5 (c) (1)) is silent on a file name for a subcontractor (i.e. Offeror's_Name_Sub_Name_Vol_Att0003). Please confirm that a Teammates' and/or Subcontractor's completed questionnaire is to be included in the file name Offeror's_Name_Vol_Att0003. If not the case, please confirm that the naming convention should account for both Prime and Teammates/Subcontractors	The naming convention should account for the Offeror and each proposed Teammate and Major Subcontractor expected to perform 20% or more of the total estimated dollar value.
16	L.5.4.2.7.1 (f)	Please confirm that the offeror is not required to submit file name Offeror's_Name_Sub/Team_Name_Vol_4_CompSelect if the offeror selected its Teammates/Subcontractors on a non-competitive basis.	Confirmed.
