Mr. Timothy W. Powers was appointed Chief, Regional Contracting Office, Hawaii on 9 August 2015. He is responsible for the planning, managing, and executing a comprehensive installation contracting program that provides cradle to grave contracting for services, supplies, and construction that annually executes over 200 million dollars. His office is responsible for the development of acquisition plans and strategies in support of the US Army Garrison-Hawaii and operational missions throughout Hawaii to include reach back contracting support for joint and bilateral deployments, exercises, and contingency contracting missions for the Army Service Component Commander across the Pacific. Mr. Powers leads a staff of seventy-six Department of Army civilians and military acquisition professionals.

In 1987 Mr. Powers received a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Northern Michigan University and earned a Regular Army Commission as a second lieutenant in the Quartermaster Corps. His assignments as a Quartermaster Officer included tours of duty with the 2nd Infantry Division, Republic of Korea, 25th Infantry Division, Schofield Barracks Hawaii, and Tank Automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM), Warren Michigan where he served as Commander, Headquarters Company TACOM.

In 1995 Mr. Powers was assessed in the US Army Acquisition Corps and attended Advance Civil Schooling at the Florida Institute of Technology (FIT) at Fort Lee, Virginia where he earned a Master's Degree in Materiel Acquisition Management. Upon graduating from FIT, Mr. Powers was assigned to the Program Executive Office – Light Tactical Vehicles (PEO-LTV), Warren Michigan, where he served as a Weapon Systems Integrator. After serving with PEO-LTV Mr. Powers went on to serve in the Program Office for the Family of Medium Tactical Vehicles (FMTV) where he managed the Total Package Fielding program.

In 1998 Mr. Powers was assigned to the Republic of Korea where he served as a Contingency Contracting Operations (CCO) Officer. During his tour in Korea Mr. Powers served in various contracting positions of increased responsibility to include Branch Chief, Supply, Subsistence and Automation, Chief, Regional Contracting Office – Area I, and Chief of Compliance and Policy. From December 2005 to June 2012 Mr. Powers served with the 411th Contracting Support Brigade as Chief for both the Services Division and Contract Support Division. From June 2012 until his arrival at the 413th CSB, Mr. Powers served as the Director of Contracting, Korea Contracting Center, where he led a staff of over 125 DA Civilian, Local Nationals, and military contracting professionals that provided cradle to grave contracting support to four US Army Garrisons, 8th Army, and United States Forces Korea.

Mr. Powers is Level III certified in Contracting and Level II Certified in Acquisition Management.
