Mr. Bryan R. Samson became the Executive Director of the U.S. Army Expeditionary Contracting Command, on Oct. 2, 2013. He previously served as the Deputy to the Commanding General, since his appointment to the Senior Executive Service in November 2010.

ECC is a subordinate command to the Army Contracting Command and provides effective and agile expeditionary contracting across the full spectrum of military operations for Army service component commands and federal agencies. Along with acquisition programs in support of Soldiers, civilians, and their families at Army installations outside of the continental United States, ECC also plans and performs expeditionary contracting during military and humanitarian operations.

As the ECC Deputy, he was responsible for leading the command's staff activities and managing more than 1,800 military, Department of the Army civilians, and Foreign Local National personnel worldwide. The command has awarded and managed more than 47,000 contractual actions valued at more than \$1.8 billion annually with a total contracting value of more than \$21 billion. ECC supports 120 contingency contracting missions in 45 countries each year.

He has previously served as Chief of the Office of the Principal Assistant Responsible for Contracting at the ACC-Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.; PARC, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, Fort Belvoir, Va.; and Director of Contracting, Aberdeen Proving Ground. A retired Army Quartermaster and Acquisition Corps officer, Mr. Samson held numerous command and staff positions during his more than 20-year career. After retiring from the military, he served as City Manager in his hometown of Horseheads, located in the Finger Lakes region of Upstate New York.

Mr. Samson is married to Connie Fox-Samson. They have two children: Chelsea, a fourth-year medical student at Vanderbilt University and Abigail, a sophomore at the Wharton School of Business, University of Pennsylvania.
