The Army Contracting Command has seven major contracting centers that provide contracting expertise and support to AMC's Life Cycle Management Commands and Major Subordinate Commands. AMC is the Army's premier provider of materiel readiness – technology, acquisition support, materiel development, logistics power projection and sustainment – to the total force, across the full spectrum of joint military operations.

## **The contracting centers are aligned with AMC's Life Cycle Management Commands and Major Subordinate Commands:**

- **Army Contracting Command – Redstone, Redstone Arsenal, Ala.**, services the U.S. Army Aviation and Missile Command Life Cycle Management Command, headquartered on Redstone Arsenal, providing contracting support to the life cycle management of Army aviation and missile systems, from research and development to procurement and production, from spare parts availability to flight safety, and from maintenance and overhaul to eventual retirement.

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- **Army Contracting Command – Aberdeen Proving Ground, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.,** provides comprehensive, contracting and business advisory skills supporting research and development, production support and depot-level maintenance activities in acquiring, fielding and sustaining Army weapon systems, services and Soldier support.
- **Army Contracting Command – Picatinny, Picatinny Arsenal, N.J.,** services the Joint Munitions and Lethality Life Cycle Management Command, headquartered on Picatinny Arsenal, providing contracting support to research, development, production, storage, distribution and demilitarization of all conventional ammunition and the personnel, organizations, infrastructure and processes required for effective life cycle management of conventional ammunition within DoD used by the Joint warfighter.
- **Army Contracting Command – National Capital Region, Alexandria, Va.,** supports the Department of Army staff within the Military District of Washington, and provides acquisition of non-tactical information technology and services for the Army.
- **Army Contracting Command – Warren, Warren, Mich.,** services the TACOM Life Cycle Management Command headquartered in Warren, Michigan, providing contracting support to develop, acquire, field, and sustain Soldier and ground systems for America’s warfighters.
- **Army Contracting Command – Rock Island, Rock Island, Ill.,** services the Army Sustainment Command, the Joint Munitions Command and provides reachback support to the Expeditionary Contracting Command. ACC-RI provides contracting support to Joint Munitions Command’s production, storage, issue and demilitarization of conventional ammunition for all U.S. military services. ACC-RI also supports Army Sustainment Command’s distribution and sustainment of materiel to and from the Field, as well as the execution of the Logistics Civil Augmentation Program (LOGCAP). The Army Sustainment Command and the Joint Munitions Command are both headquartered on Rock Island Arsenal.

# Mission and Installation Contracting Command

The Mission and Installation Contracting Command (MICC) is an Army Contracting Command subordinate command and is part of the Army's Generating Force and plans, integrates, awards, and administers contracts that support Army commands, direct reporting units, U.S. Army North and other organizations to provide the best value for the mission, Soldiers and their Families. The MICC provides contracting capabilities and services within the continental United States. Its major customers include the U.S.



Army Installation Management Command, the U.S. Army Forces Command, the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command, the U.S. Army Reserve Command, and the U.S. Army Medical Command.



MICC utilizes seven installation contracting centers and 35

installation contracting offices. It employs about 1,300 civilian and military personnel throughout the continental United States, Alaska and Puerto Rico to provide essential commodities and services to Soldiers and their families through base operations and power projection. MICC offices support Army schools and training centers (the National Training Center and the Joint Readiness Training Center) and a variety of other missions for tenants on Army installations.

The MICC centers and offices also provide technical, hands-on contracting training and experience for most Army contingency contracting Soldiers.


