

Background

- ***US Army formally established the Mission and Installation Contracting Command (MICC) as a major subordinate command of the US Army Contracting Command (ACC), based on recommendations from the Gansler Commission.***
- ***MICC was formed from a legacy contracting agency which was reorganized to support the Generating Force and Installation / Garrison Support Operations.***
- ***MICC unfurled the command colors and Brigadier General Stephen Leisenring formally assumed of command at an official ceremony held in November 2009 at Fort Sam Houston, TX.***





MICC Command Philosophy








ACC / MICC Task Organization

MICC Mission / Vision

Mission

The United States Army Mission and Installation Contracting Command (MICC), part of the Army's Generating Force, plans, integrates, awards, and administers contracts throughout the ARFORGEN Cycle supporting the Army Commands (ACOMs), Direct Reporting Units* (DRUs), USARNORTH and other organizations to provide the best value for the mission, Soldiers and their Families.

Vision

The MICC functions as an integral and indispensable partner in accomplishing the Army's mission through contracted materiel and services solutions.

**Note... IMCOM , USAREC, USACIDC and USMA are a Direct Reporting Units IAW AR 10-87, Army Commands, Army Service Component Commands, and Direct Reporting Units, dated 4 Sep 07.*



Intent for Contracting Support

1. **Meeting customer's requirements.** Customers need an organizational structure that is consistent and parallel with their organization.
2. **Translational throughout ACC mission areas.** ARFORGEN process.
3. **Best Value.** Based on customer mission and organization factors (economies, constraints).
4. **Supports tailored solutions (decision points / decision cycles).** Size of mission, CLS, multiple customer synergy.
